## FINDS HUSBAND'S LIFELESS BODY

Mrs. William Quinn of Ray Street,  
Went to Call Husband, But  
Death Forestalled Her.

Going to call her husband, William Quinn, of 112 North Ray street, early Sunday morning, Mrs. Quinn was horrified to find his lifeless body on the bed. The discovery was made about 5 o'clock in the morning. A physician was summoned hastily, but he stated that death had probably resulted some time before, during the early part of the night. His death was a great shock to his family, as he had not been ill.

The deceased was a foreman at the No. 2 furnace of the Carnegie company, a position which he had held for some time. He was 50 years of age, and came to America 30 years ago from Ireland, his native land.
