FOUND DEAD IN BED BY HIS WIFE SUNDAY

WILLIAM QUINN OF RAY STREET
EXPIRED SUDDENLY AT AN
EARLY HOUR YESTER-
DAY.

William Quinn of 112 North Ray street was found dead in bed by his wife Sunday morning when she went to call him for breakfast. Mr. and Mrs. Quinn had occupied the same room Saturday night. When Mrs. Quinn arose at 4:30 yesterday morning to get her husband his breakfast before he should go to work, nothing unusual was noticed and she was of the opinion that he was sleeping soundly.

After preparing the morning meal, she went to the stairs and called him several times, but getting no response she hastened to the bedroom and shook him. It was then that she discovered that he was dead. Other members of the household were aroused and a physician summoned. Upon making an examination the doctor announced that Mr. Quinn had been dead for some little time.

The deceased was quite well known in this city and friends of the family were shocked to learn of his death.

He was 50 years of age and had been foreman of No. 2nd furnace for a number of years.

Besides his wife Mr. Quinn is survived by ten children. They are Mrs. Mary Boyle, Ella, Tressa, Josephine, William, Sadie, Rose, Arthur, Joseph and Thomas. One sister, Mrs. Margaret Rodgers of Philadelphia, also survives.

The funeral will take place Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock from St. Mary's church. Interment in St. Mary's cemetery.
